## From the President's Desk

CDS has been an influential part of the Boston Dance scene since 1915. We are proud to have contributed to the development of many local callers and musicians. Although this season has been financially poor for CDS, we do not measure our success by numbers alone.

About seven years ago, the crowded conditions at the Cambridge YWCA forced us to move our Tuesday dance to Chestnut Hill. The current attendance level now provides us the opportunity to explore new options. To supplement the items in our suggestion book, we have solicited and received advice from many dancers and dance leaders.

We have decided to bring the Tuesday night dance back to Cambridge. Starting in September, our Tuesday night dance will be held at the First Congregational Church, at Mason and Garden Streets, just off the Common. You may have already danced in this hall, which has a fine floor and pleasant acoustics.

We are aware that the vitality of Harvard Square includes a parking problem. But the Square is an exciting place, with many places to eat or snack (before and after the dance), and good connections for public transportation.

The program will feature many local and out-of-town callers and musicians. Our dance will be a quality dance - fun and satisfying for experienced dancers and newcomers alike.

- \* TELEPHONE ANSWERING MACHINE - Voice-activated recording, variable-length outgoing message, dual-cassette, must be programmable by remote (so that we can place a weather cancellation notice on the tape without a trip to the office), preferably touch-tone keyboard remote control. Your donation will save CDS about \$150.

## News from Maine

English Country Dancing is alive and well in Brunswick, Maine, under the direction of several aspiring dance leaders and supported by the music of the Nonesuch Country Dance Band. It has been nearly three years now since we got our start with George Fogg and a grant from Boston CDS. We continue to meet regularly on the third Saturday of every month.

We try to add a little spice to the dancing by having a special surprise each month. Past offerings have included a pancake race (with a copy of the Bare Necessities album for a prize), a story time teaching the moral of the Tichborne Dole, Maypole dancing, and one evening in which all the dances were chosen around the theme of the hey.

July promises to be another special evening. The Pejepscot Historical Society of Brunswick, Maine, is fortunate to have in its collection a handwritten manuscript, dated 1795, which apparently was the working copy of notes belonging to a dancing master in Topsham. So far we have not been able to identify many of the thirty dances notated with dances found in other published sources. We have made an effort to reconstruct the dances from the notes and to choose appropriate tunes for them. We will offer a selection of these at a dance jointly sponsored with the PHS on July 21 at the Varney Lecture Hall, School Street, Brunswick, Maine. There will be a workshop from 3 to 5PM for beginners, followed by a dance at 8PM for all, with the proceeds going to benefit the PHS. Period dress is welcome. 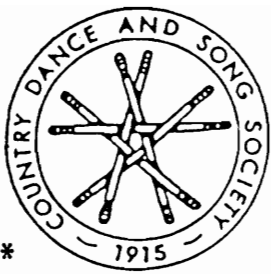

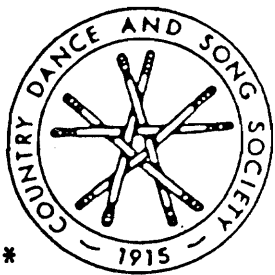

## LABOR DAY WEEKEND 1984

## RITUAL DANCE 1984-1985

Well, once again CDS-Boston Centre has closed the season at Pinewoods with a fine Labor Day Weekend. This year camp was filled a week after the lottery date, and there was soon a waiting list of 20 men and women. But "wait-listed" people should take heart: many of those 20 had been accepted into camp by Saturday, the 1st of September!

A special feature of the weekend was a "Silent Auction", the proceeds of which were donated to CDSS to help pay the cost of rebuilding C#. Some fascinating objects and services were offered and over \$1000 was raised. C#, by the way, was inspected and approved on Friday, August 31, so participants in Campers' Week got to inaugurate the hall that night. It was used for dancing throughout Labor Day Weekend, and "Blackwell Hall" was a featured dance on Monday night, to honor the efforts of Jim Blackwell, who has put a hard summer into seeing this project at last completed. Congratulations, Jim; it's worth the wait!

Sunday night's dance was a costume ball, the theme being "20,000 Leagues Under C#". The hall was delightfully decorated, and so were the dancers! This festive event was followed by a Talent Show which revealed unexpected depths (and heights) in some of our campers.
