# A Very Special Job

Evelyn Lamond, our CDS/BC historian, has recently brought to our notice a wonderful piece of our past: a tape made in 1958 of interviews with a group of old-time CDS members, including Louise Chapin and Lily and Dick Conant, who are recounting their memories of "the good old days". The speakers represent a span of years from 1917 through the 30's and 40's, and the tape is therefore a history of our organization from the mouths of its founders and builders. It should be of great interest to us all to hear of their work.

The tape has been copied, and now exists as two 90-minute cassette tapes. *But* ... no one has ever undertaken the enormous work of transcribing the tape, and it is therefore not very accessible for CDS members to enjoy.

### **Admission to Pinewoods Events**

In 1983 a committee appointed by the Board of Directors spent some time drafting a uniform admissions policy for CDS's Pinewoods events, intended to equitably distribute acceptance to camp, and to make clear on application flyers the manner in which admission lotteries were run. In the past, many members had complained of misunderstandings about lottery deadlines, the policy of accepting by a sex-balanced ratio, and other problems.

The committee felt that the lottery mechanisms and the sex-balance policy were in the best interests of an enjoyable weekend for all, and recommended that they be continued, but clearly stated on applications, along with dates when acceptance letters would be sent, and a deadline for final payment.

Application flyers this year reflected the adoption of the committee's recommendations. There are, therefore, two deadlines for CDS Pinewoods events: the first for the initial acceptance lottery, and the second for receipt of final payment. The second deadline is aimed at reducing the work the chairperson and other volunteers must do at camp, as well as discouraging late drop-outs.

Our two weekends are both "sell-outs" at this point, and inevitably there are those who are not accepted and who are therefore disappointed. We urge everyone to note deadlines for our events carefully, and to plan to apply early!

### **Board Notes**

The CDS-BC Board of Directors met on Friday, 6 September, at the Church of Our Savior in Brookline. Twelve voting members were present.

Treasurer Charlie Hornig brought the board up to date on both the Bolles Fund and the Chapin Fund. The Bolles Fund money is available to CDS members to defray costs of attending CDSS weeks at Pinewoods. The Chapin Fund is used to promote and foster the goals of the Boston Centre. Look for an article detailing these valuable resources elsewhere in this newsletter.

Membership secretary Arthur Ferguson reports that, as of 1 September, 1985, CDS has 195 members and \$2,385 in collected membership fees.

Deborah D'Amico presented a report on English/Scottish Week 1985. Despite the fact that the committee's enrollment goal of 100 campers was not reached, the week realized a small profit, which will be used as seed money to begin planning the 1986 week. Deborah reported that the week was enthusiastically received by all campers and urged the board to agree to continue co-sponsoring this joint effort. English/Scottish Week will run 30 June — 4 July, 1986, co-sponsored by CDS and RSCDS. The board thanked Deborah D'Amico and Cynthia Whear for their work on this year's committee, and RSCDS for their efforts toward making this year's week such a success.

A recent Pinewoods User Group meeting established the summer Pinewoods schedule for several upcoming years. The next CDS July Weekend will run 26 — 30 June, 1986.

CDS will be sponsoring an English Dance on 21 September at a location to be announced. This dance will follow, and celebrate, the annual Fall Morris Tour. The next meeting will be held Sunday, 6 October, at the home of Allan Wechsler.

# The July (?) Weekend

There's good news for CDS members in 1986. Our Boston Centre Weekend, although it will not be on the July 4th weekend, will be a long one! We will begin on Thursday evening, June 26th, and will end on Monday morning, June 30th, thus having four evening dances and three full days of program. Plan your time now for next year!

This schedule was arrived at after a really great meeting among representatives of all the Pinewoods user groups, in which our various needs and desires were discussed, and we at CDS are pleased not only with the generosity of Folk Arts Center and Marianne Taylor in working out this time with us for 1986, but with all the participants for their cooperation in seeking fair and equitable solutions to the problems our expanding programs have created. And we are happy to say that, although the schedule is not yet finalized, we will probably have July 4th weekend for our own in 1987!

### **CDS Endowment Funds**

CDS has two memorial funds, one established in 1941 in memory of Dorothy Bolles, a dedicated teacher and long-time member of the Society, and the other established in 1979 in memory of Louise Chapin, also a member for many years, and a teacher of English country dance. The bylaws of both funds stipulate that only the interest from the funds may be used, and that unused interest reverts back to the principal after a certain time.

The purpose of the Bolles Fund is to provide scholatrship funds for worthy recipients to attend the Pinewoods Summer Camp program. In most years, two to four applicants are chosen to receive half or full scholarships to such events as English-American Week or English Dance Week. This year, for a variety of reasons, the Bolles Fund scholarships were not awarded. Applicants for the Scholarships will be solicited both in our Boston Newsletter and in the National CDSS Newsletter early next year.

The Chapin Fund's purpose is "to promote and foster the goals of the Country Dance Society, Boston Centre". It is not intended to support the regular weekly and monthly activities of CDS, and so it has never been considered as a source of income to offset the deficits our weekly series have sometimes run. Such projects as the replacement of swords and sticks for the Ritual Dance classes or the production of a book of "Boston Centre" dances are, however, within the range of appropriate uses of the Chapin Fund.

Any member with a project that might merit Chapin Fund support is encouraged to write to the Chairman of the Endowment Committee, or to the Board of Directors, Country Dance Society, at the office address, 595 Massachusetts Avenue, Room 210, Cambridge, MA 02139. Neither fund was used in 1985, and we would welcome your suggestions for their use next year.

## CDS Pinewoods Work Weekend

For a number of years now, Folk Arts Center has sponsored the first work weekend after Labor Day at Pinewoods, as a measure of their support. It has become almost a Pinewoods event in itself, with a great spirit of community which produces both lots of hard work, which Pinewoods needs, and lots of good camaraderie and dancing, which we all need.

We would very much like to have CDS-BC establish such a tradition, and are aiming to sponsor the first work weekend of next spring. The more of us who commit ourselves to such a weekend, the better time we can have, while making a significant contribution to Pinewoods. Plan now to come to Pinewoods in the spring of 1986, to see the ladyslippers in bloom and to experience a different and wonderful time at one of our favorite places!

## **Feedback**

Several years ago, CDS sponsored a development program for new teachers of English Country Dance. Now, we believe, it's time — and only fair — to offer opportunities for commentary and feedback.

(We are asking that you *not* try to convey opinions during dances because we like to dance too!) For now, the opinion collectors will be President Mary Stafford and President-Elect Betty Hoskins. They will collate and balance the feedback, then sit down individually with each teacher during the course of the next dance season.

We'd like your comments, both on this approach to feedback and on strengths or improvements you'd like conveyed to each teacher.


