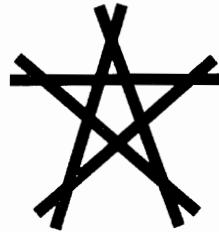

First Weekend at Pinewoods

The First Weekend at Pinewoods took place June 17-19, 1994; I'm happy to report that all our goals seemed to have been met! The weekend made a profit of \$618. One of our strategies was to ensure we had a full camp, following all the advertising suggestions received from the CDS board in the fall of '93; as a result of these activities, we had a waitlist of about 3-5 people. The transition to a new camp manager during the planning period went extremely well. We did not succeed in getting a lifeguard for the weekend; everything went well anyway.

Everyone seemed to have a great time; I know it was one of my most enjoyable weekends. We received 29 completed program questionnaires and they were all quite positive. In general, people thought the staff was great—Ed Durham and Sarah Gregory and Bill Smith were mentioned many many times as being wonderful; people would like to see them back again and again. There was a large number (58) of kids at camp; the focus on the kids of all ages was a big plus. There were a fair number of people who were new to Pinewoods or to First Weekend and they seemed to have a good time and want to come again.

Thanks to everyone who helped, including the CDS Board, all the volunteers, and our co-chairs Stephanie and Michael; I'm not sure we could have done it without them! I think we can all look forward to a great First Weekend next year as they take over the work of running the show.

The following are mostly direct statements, repeated on more than one program questionnaire that was filled in on the last day of camp.

What people valued about the weekend: *Relaxed atmosphere. Great kids' activities and the swimming. Good singing and dancing activities. Nice community feeling. Being able to bring our kids, introducing them to Pinewoods.*

Reserve Early for Playford Ball

The Playford Ball is an annual opportunity to experience elegance in English Country Dance. The CDS 1995 Ball will be held on Saturday, March 4, 1995 (8pm - midnight), at the Weston Town Hall in Weston, Massachusetts.

Helene Cornelius will be the Mistress of Ceremonies; music will be provided by Bare Necessities. An afternoon workshop (2-5pm) will be held at the Hall to rehearse the evening's dances, which will be only minimally prompted.

The cost for Ball and Workshop will be \$21.00 per person for registrations postmarked on or before January 8, 1995, and \$23.00 for later-postmarked registrations. There is a limit of 100 attendees, so make your decision early. Call the office if you need additional information.

Labor Day '94

All of these traditions seem dear to the campers. They were all well-attended and drew many responses on the evaluations.

The weather was chilly and drizzling rain most of the weekend, which limited the swimming and other outdoor activities. Folks participated and enjoyed the weekend nevertheless: all fireplaces were in use; Dan and Shelagh made a run for cocoa; there were several indoor "rainy-day" workshops that were quite popular; and the Mad Hatter Tea Party, held in the Camp House, was a highlight of the weekend. They were wonderful. They participated cheerfully despite the rainy cold and played for more workshops than required. The campers loved them and said on their evaluations, "Invite them all back".

We had a record number of children (43, compared to 25 the last two years). Half the adult campers brought children and half

art activities. Excellent choices of dances in the evenings—beginners felt successful and experienced dancers had some more challenging dances to do also. Keep having a quiet time in the days' schedule. Sarah Smith's family dance was a high point in the activities. (mentioned many times) The two loops for the baby-sitting co-op was very good with this number of kids in camp. Liked the emphasis that after 9 p.m. is for adults at the dance.

What could be improved: *Food wasn't plain enough for some families with kids. Could the weekend be longer? Til 8p.m. on Sunday? Stay until Monday a.m.? Lunch cafeteria style was the pits. Keep a focus on offering activities for people of all ages. Try starting the Friday night dance at 9 and*

continue after 11 in the Camphouse—will make for more time at the evening gathering on that first night. Suggestion for a new job—chair clearers after the dance parties, so that the party set-up people don't have to. After-dance party set-up folks need more help—they miss most of the dance.

did not. We have recommended that next year's chairs make some modifications to the staffing and program for better accommodation of the increased number of families while still maintaining the familiar programming and relaxed flavor of the weekend.

Our stated goal was to expand our publicity efforts and fill camp; this goal was achieved. In addition to sending out flyers in the News and putting flyers at local Boston dances, we had flyers at NEFFA, First Weekend, July 4th Weekend, and at dances in Western Mass., the Cape, Rhode Island, Connecticut, New York, Vermont, New Hampshire, and Maine. We also had articles in the News and the Dance Gypsy Newsletter. Approximately 25 people attended who had not been to Labor Day before. Our profit was \$1058 plus extra party food and paper goods brought back to be used by CDS.

The past weekend chairs and those who have taken on responsible positions year after year were invaluable in making the weekend go smoothly. In particular, I would like to extend my thanks to the following people—it wouldn't have been nearly as good without their expertise and willing assistance: Michael Resnick, Diane Biglow, Jack Janssen, Michael Weinreich, JJ Jones, Mitch Diamond, Barbara Nichols, Judy Francis, Pat Callahan, and Ann Jeffris. Dan Pearl and Shelagh Ellman-Pearl took on responsible jobs as part of their training to be the new chairs; their involvement and hard work was especially appreciated.
