Summer Series Returns to Springstep

Starting July 13, you can dance in air conditioned comfort for eight summer Wednesday nights at Springstep in Medford. Again this year, Helene Cornelius has done a great job in assembling leaders and musicians for our summer series. You can support CDS, help the door sitters, and save yourself fumbling for change by buying a summer series ticket for \$42, good for all 8 dances. All dances will follow a party format—all dances will be walked through, but less time is spent on style. Dances go from 7:30-10:30 PM.

The series begins on July 13 with Robin Hayden, with Jacqueline Schwab, pianist. Those of you who came to Robin's dance last year remember what a nice time we had helping Robin and Aaron celebrate their anniversary. It continues with Brad Foster on July 20, with musicians Jacqueline Schwab, Mary Lea, and Fred Nussbaum. Fred is a cellist from Portland OR, married to Nan Evans, an English country dance leader whom some of you may know. In succeeding weeks the leaders are Barbara Finney, Graham Christian, Michael Cicone, Jenny Beer from Philadelphia, Rich Jackson, and, to end the season, Gene Murrow on August 31. The musicians accompanying our leaders are members of Bare Necessities and talented regional players. The list includes Karen Axelrod, Ken Allen, Anna Patton, and Lydia Ievens.

Wanted: A Piano and Your Advice

Many dancers and an even greater proportion of musicians have noticed that the CDS-BC piano at the Park Avenue church in Arlington is frequently out of tune. In fact, it has become so unstable that tuning in the morning no longer guarantees that it will still be in tune for an evening dance. The Board has been talking with the musicians who use the piano and with other professionals to develop a plan for replacement or repair. We have learned from professionals that this model of Steinway has a history of problems with the pin block and that even spending \$7,000 to 10,000 to refurbish it won't guarantee a lasting repair.

Recognizing the importance of providing an appropriate instrument for our excellent musicians and a satisfying musical experience for all, the Board is looking into replacing the current piano, preferably

New England Dances

The New England Dance Committee rounds out the season with two dances in June. Pinewoods Camp Update

Pinewoods Camp, Inc. is at a pivotal moment in its history. Over the past several years, facilities have been improved significantly, and Camp is implementing a long-range plan for further upgrades. Its current relative strength makes this the time to provide for the future of Pinewoods Camp. The Pinewoods board of directors has authorized a capital campaign to meet the following urgent priorities: to ensure that Pinewoods can continue to upgrade major facilities without changing the character of the camp, responding to uninsured emergencies when necessary; and to protect camp from encroaching development.

Pinewoods Camp has operated at close to full capacity for a number of years, supported by camper fees and, more recently, annual giving campaigns. The board of directors remains committed to preserving the camp's pristine environment, and important upgrades have been completed with minimal visible changes, even though this approach is significantly more expensive than replacing buildings. Recent major projects include:

Dance spaces, sound systems, and facilities for musicians have been improved.

Bathroom and shower facilities have been added.

Key buildings, such as C Sharp, the camphouse, and the user group office, have undergone major renovations.

A two-year project to improve the function and the aesthetics of the entrance to camp is underway, and the PCI board is looking at ways to improve accessibility for individuals with handicaps. Plans for the next few years include rebuilding C# Minor dance pavilion after a large tree fell on the roof in late 2004; significant work on Ampleforth, whose foundation has settled badly; and major work on the dining hall.

Pinewoods Camp has taken numerous steps to protect the camp from development pressures in the neighboring community, and there are further concrete steps that PCI can take to make a real difference in this regard. Having the financial resources to participate in projects like these on short notice gives PCI an important voice in the future of our area.

Pinewoods Camp is taking a careful and deliberate approach through a completed feasibility study, conversation with the user groups, and formation of a campaign committee. CDS Boston Centre is enthusiastic about the improvements and financial stability of Pinewoods Camp, and plans on contributing to the upcoming campaign to ensure the continued viability of such a wonderful resource.

by the start of the next season in September. This raises some interesting questions.

What do our members and musicians think about the relative merits of electric and acoustic pianos? The decision will depend on many factors, but we are sincerely interested to hear what you think, especially if you have direct experience with electric pianos.

We are, of course, looking into possibilities for purchase of a new or second-hand piano. Occasionally, someone needs to find a new home for a much-loved

instrument. Our present piano was donated—for a handsome tax write-off—to CDS-BC over twenty years ago. If this possibility does not arise, we believe that buying a piano would be a reasonable investment, both because it is unlikely to lose its value, and because of the obvious benefit we have from its use.

As the Board continues to discuss these questions, please call Julian at (781) 862 2069 if you have a piano that you would consider donating or selling to CDS-BC. What could possibly make a piano happier than to be played regularly by our fine musicians and appreciated by happy dancers!
