PINE MOUNTAIN SETTLEMENT SCHOOL WRITES

At the Pine Mountain Settlement School, the folk dancing is very much a part of our life, and it is done as spontaneously and constantly almost as eating and sleeping.

Nearly every Saturday evening we have a party in our large central dining room. The entire evening is spent in country dancing. The room is ideal for this purpose. In fact when Cecil Sharp came here years ago, he thought it the best room he had ever seen for this, because the floor has a particular kind of spring, which makes the dancing easy and pleasant. The children are never tired of dancing.

We have no seasonal dancing, really, for it goes on all through the year, taking the place of games, sports of certain kinds, and nearly all social activity. During the week, while school is in session there are classes every night for the beginners, and less frequently for advanced students. The classes are taught by the former student of the school, now a worker, who has had all her training at Pine Mountain.

This fall we took a special group of girls and boys on quite an extensive tour through the middle west and east, with the idea of carrying the folk dances and folk songs to people all over the country.

Other groups from the school have traveled to colleges and various conventions, with the same kind of program. A good deal has been done by the School to make the folk culture known and appreciated in this immediate region. Usually at the end of a concert the students teach the audience some of the simple dances, with a good deal of success.

In all, our boys and girls are familiar with fifty or more country dances. We have boys' sword teams, and girls' and boys' morris teams, with a varied repertoire.

The climax of the folk dancing comes each spring. During the month of April every evening is given to learning new dances, preparing exhibition dances and jigs, and finally on May Day we hold our May festival, with dances for the entire school around the May pole outdoors, and then the special dances from different classes and houses and picked groups, in the dining room. The day is a real exhibit of skilled performance, and usually we have guests on that day who are professional country dancers from England and New England.
